Research Investment

25% of the funds raised in our community goes to the Komen Awards & Research Grants and 75% stays in our community to fund education, outreach, treatment, screening, and other services to help survivors. In 2014, Komen San Diego contributed \$380,000 to the research effort. Next to the U.S. government, Komen is the largest funder of breast cancer research in the world. Every step forward in the war on this disease has been touched by a Komen grant. Not one penny of the research payment Komen San Diego makes to its national office goes to overhead—every penny funds research.
